

# I. Executive Summary

Measure A, passebly voters on May 3, 2022, authorize Livermore Valley Joint Unified School District ("LVJUSD) to levy a qualified special tax of \$166 year on each parcel of taxablereal property in the District for 7 years The parcel tax commence on July1, 2022.

The Full Text of Measure attached as an appendix states that moneys raised may be spent only on purposes named in the measure, specifically to

- x Provide elementary science and-TX technology specialists
- x Attract and retain highly qualified techers
- x Maintain academic achievement in math, science, reading, writing, engineering and technology
- x Keep classroom technology and instructional material scupate
- x Maintain small class sizes
- x Keep schools wellhaintained

and to provide other financial support to the extent of available funds to maintain and support the District's academic programs, including the purchase of instructional equipment, materials and supplies.

MeasureA's Accountability Provisions equire the establishment of an fildependent Citizens' Oversight Committe ensure that moneys raised are "spent wisely and only for the purposes named."

Based on theinformation provided by District and school site staff, the Committee concludes that the Measure A fundsaised by the LVJSD in 20232024 have been sperotr, if expended as budgeted for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2024, will be spent on purposes named in the measure.
Measure A fundappear to have been spent wisely insofar as they were budgeted and accounted for on an ongoing basis and used for the benefit of all LVJUSD school sites, to

and to provide other financial support to the extent of available funds to maintain and support the District's academic programs, including the purchase of instructional equipment, materials and supplies.

Measure A's Accountability Provisions contain "Independent Annual Audit" provision.

The Accountability Provisions alsoquire the LVJUSD Board of Education stoablish an "Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee" to ensure that moneys raiseled parcel ax are "spent wisely and only for the purposes named."

According to the Accountability Provisions, "All of the purposes named in this [measure] shall constitute the specic purposes of the education parcel tax, and the proceeds thereof shall be applied only for such purposes."

# III. Committee Membership History,

On April 25, the Committee reviewed responses to the 20224Measure Aquestionnaire from schoolleaders at all 18 LVJUSD school sites discussed what additional information was needed to complete the Report. Remaining sections of the Report were assigned to Committee members and the Report lan was refined.

Between April 25 and May 23, Committee members received and reviewed condulit information requested and submitted their assigned section to CoChair Harris, who completed and circulated the draft Report.

On May 23, the Committee reviewed the drafteportand approvedt.

The Report was finalized May 31.

### Jackson Avenue Elementary

"Jackson Avenue has two elementary science specialists that students in grades 15. Each class receives 2 forty minutes siens of hands on instruction. Our science specialists work closely with our general ed. the hers to monitor progress of science standards and TWIG curriculum. The science specialists also host Family Science Night every other year.

### Joe Michell TK-8 School

"Michell has 1 FTE science specialist apdrt time science specialist ach grade level-5 gets 2 40 minute sessions of hands on instruction science teachers collaborate with the teachers to alter [sid] TWIG curriculum with PLTW. We also have a Family Science Night that is hosted by our science specialists.

### Sunset Elementary

"We have two Science specials with teach two 40 minute pull out sciences ses per week for every class. Those teachers also planted be Science Night, planetarium nightc. They have worked losely with teachers planning the in class portion of the TWIG curriculum and helping them to prepare their labs.

# 2. Maintain Academic Achievement Math, ScienceReading, Writing, Engineering, and Technology

Measure A funds may be used to "maintain academic achievement in math, sqieadeng, writing, engineering and technology."

The LVJUSD allocated \$1,285,897, or approximally of the Measure A budget, for this purpose during the 2023-2024 fiscal year total of 8.8333 FTE position were funded

Five teachers of Senceand STEM Exploration courses girades 6-8, at Christensen Middle School, East Avenue Middle School, Joe Michell School Junction Avenue TK-8 School, and William Mendenhall Middle School, were funded at .75 FTE each.

At the high school leves, ixteachers were funded: 2 FTE positions at Granada High School, 2.8333 FTE positions at Livermore High School, and a .25 FTE position at Del Valle Continuation HighSchool.

The four high school teachershose positions were fully funded by Measured a range of STEM topicish courses including hysics, AP Physics Mechanics, Astronomy, IT Essentials, Business Computer Applications, Intro to Computer Program, APComputer Science, APComputer Science rinciples Robotics, Project Lead the Way ("PLTW") Principles of Engineering, PLTW Intro to Engineering Design, and Engineering Physics.

Thetwo high schooteachers whose positions were partially funded by Meres taught courses elated tobusiness, including-commerce and computer/technology applications components and culinary arts.

At leastthree of the high school teachers funded by Measure A possessed master's degrees.

# 3. Keep Classroom Technology and Instructional Materials Top Date

Measure A funds may be used to "keep classroom technology and instructional materials up date."

The LVJUSD allocated \$234,252, or approximately 6% Measure A budget, fohts purpose during the 2023/2024 fiscal year.




